Q: What three aging-in-place upgrades should Hawaii homeowners prioritize most?

A: Hawaii homeowners should prioritize these key upgrades: 1) Curbless walk-in showers with non-slip surfaces; 2) Durable, low-maintenance flooring, such as luxury vinyl tile (LVT) or tile; 3) Universal design elements, including wider doorways and hallways for wheelchair accessibility, along with strategically placed grab bars. Incorporating these features during initial construction — rather than retrofitting later — adds immediate value and supports longterm independence.
