A: Just as you wouldn't go shopping for batteries during a hurricane warning, it's wise to plan early for aging-in-place features at home. The benefits are clear: 1) Peace of mind; 2) Keeping family close; 3) Saving money on care and housing in an assisted living facility; 4) Welcoming visitors and extended *ohana*; 5) Enjoying a better quality of life in the comfort of home.

Q: What aging-in-place upgrades should Hawaii homeowners prioritize most?

A: The bathroom is the most strategic thing to plan for in aging-in-place. It is important to have a bathroom on the ground floor to accommodate residents who do not have the mobility to navigate stairs. Create a space plan to include the following features: a shower conversion with a seat; a wheelchair-accessible, convertible vanity; ample surrounding space for wheelchair movement; and grab bars throughout the bathroom.
